This garden is set in rolling countryside in the grounds of a Victorian vicarage designed by Welsh architect George Mair (1867, house not open). The garden is particularly beautiful in the spring with a variety of shrubs, trees and bulbs, a parterre, kitchen garden, wildlife areas and ponds. The cakes and refreshments are always deliciously irresistible!

Proceeds from the entry fee go to various charities, raising nearly £3.5 million in 2023. Over two-thirds of this money was donated to some of the UK's best-loved nursing and health charities supporting the NHS and communities post pandemic.

Proceeds from refreshments and plant sales are for St Cadoc's church funds and contribute to the upkeep of this beautiful and spiritual church.
